## NATURE WALK

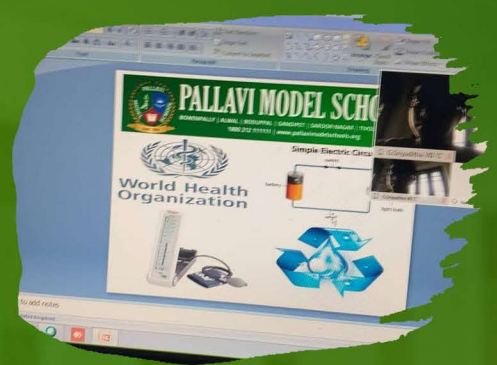
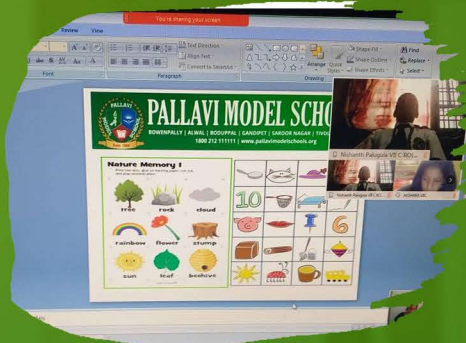
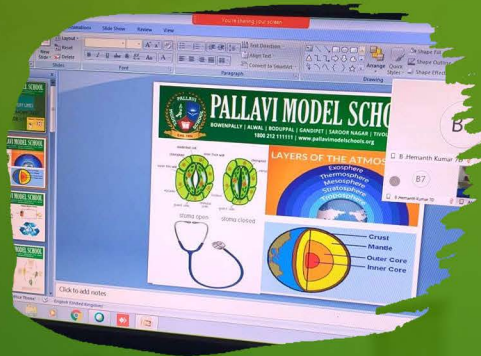

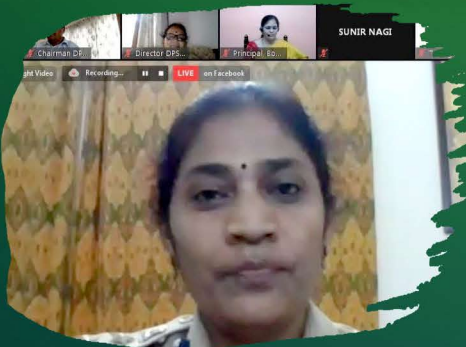
## Science Memory Test

## THE TS POLICE WOMEN'S WING'S INITIATIVE TO ENHANCE DIGITAL LITERA

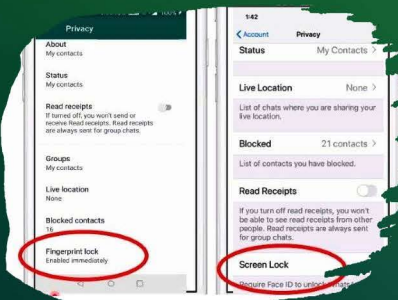
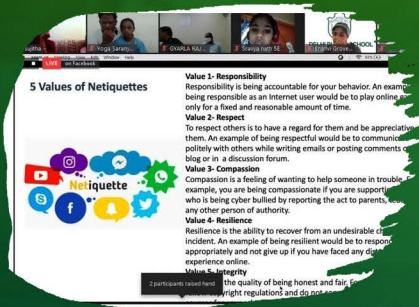
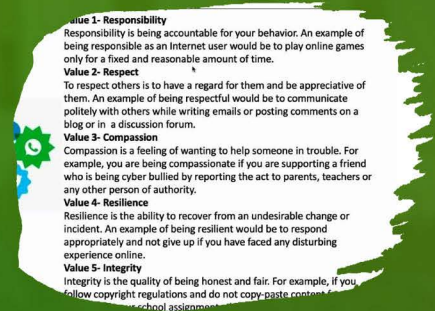

## MATH IS FUN

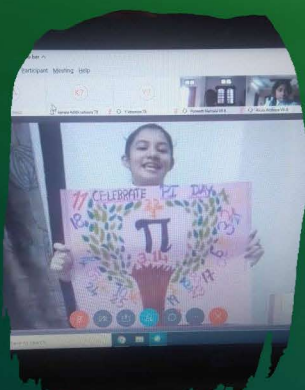

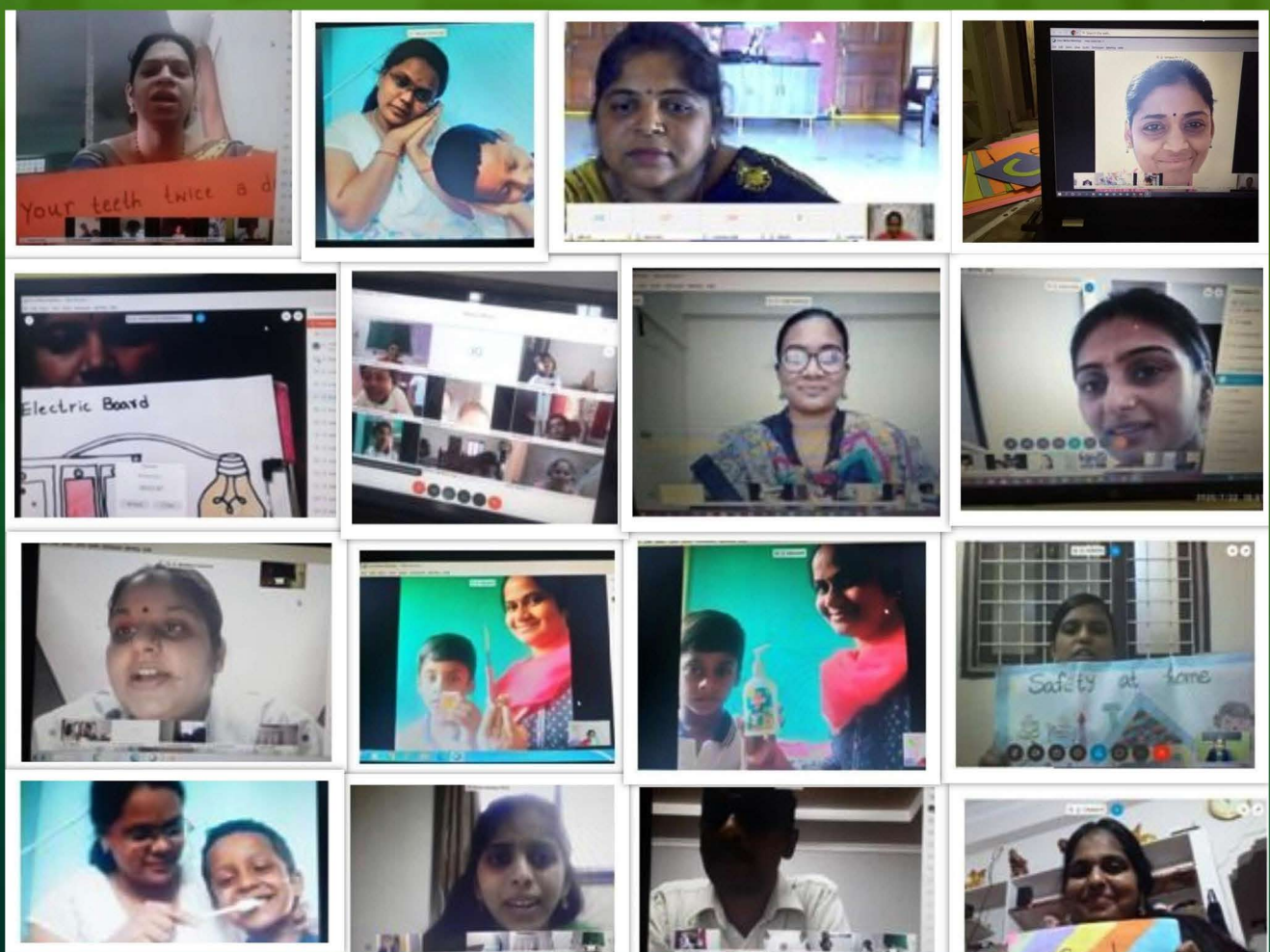

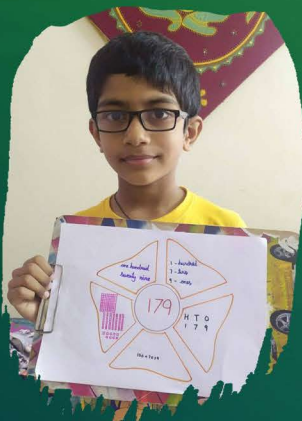
## RAKSHABANDHAN CELEBRATION
